

Dear Colleagues,

The upcoming symposium will offer many opportunities for sharing your tools, methods, approaches, perspectives, experiences, and lessons learned about what to do and what to avoid when trying provide more equitable agricultural extension services to both men and women farmers and support improved nutrition outcomes at the household, community, and national level.

This is a formal **Call for Proposals** to contribute to the types of sessions and themes described below. Please submit your proposal to Sumaiya Nour at sumaiya.nour@biid.org.bd by **Feb. 10, 2017.**



Presentations can be given either orally or through a poster display. Please indicate the preference for a poster or oral presentation, and among oral whether the preference is for a traditional format or as "shift and share". Only a very limited number of oral presentations will be selected and the determination will be made by the program committee based on quality of the abstract and relevance of the topic, i.e., how well it fits with the themes of the symposium. We expect to inform authors of abstracts selected for oral presentation by **February 20, 2016.** Proposals that are not accepted as oral presentations can still be given as poster presentations.

Oral presentation - Traditional:

- Prepare an 8-10 minute presentation with Power Point slides. There is a 15 minutes time limit for each presentation, including introduction of the speaker, the presentation and questions.
- The power point slides must be submitted to Sumaiya Nour at sumaiya.nour@biid.org.bd
 by February 28, 2017, and will be made available in electronic format to all participants.

• Oral presentation – Shift and Share:

- o Prepare a 5-10 minute verbal presentation of your work.
- Tips: think "conversational" tell the story of what you did and why it mattered. What worked? What did not? What did you learn from this? What are your recommendations to others considering similar actions. Focus on KEY points, not every detail.
- When the bell rings, take questions from your visitors. Keep notes of key new insights and interesting questions on your flip chart.
- When the second bell rings, send your visitors on to their next station and welcome your next set of visitors.
- Expect to talk to four groups, who will come to your table one after the other, over a time period of 1 hour.







Poster preparation:

- The maximum poster size is 32 x 48 inches (80 cm x 120 cm) (width x height). Accessories for mounting of posters will be provided. Author(s) should be present during the designated poster session(s).
- The poster should be submitted to Sumaiya Nour at sumaiya.nour@biid.org.bd by February 28, 2017, and will be made available in electronic format to all participants.

There will be a share fair display area in addition to the poster section. Please submit proposals for share fair contributions by February 10, 2017, as well.

• Share Fair – Put up a display table, share publications, provide handouts, and most importantly engage people in informal discussions about your work. In your proposal describe what you are planning to showcase and why this is relevant to the theme of the symposium.
