
DHAKA, BANGLADESH - An interdisciplinary team from the consortium, consisting of Andrea Bohn, Deborah Rubin, Kathy Colverson, Nikki Grey Rutamu and Maria Jones, began the kick-off work in this South Asian country in late January. Prior to the trip the team worked closely with the USAID Mission in Dhaka to identify possible stakeholders who might benefit from collaborating with INGENAES. In a span of 2 ½ weeks the team met with nearly 30 different stakeholder organizations that included NGOs, public and private sector organizations, local universities, government agencies, and international research centers. 
