This success prompted Digital Green to partner with the Voluntary Association for Rural Reconstruction and Appropriate Technology (VARRAT) and International Food Policy Research Institute (IFPRI) and conduct a pilot program and feasibility study concerning the promotion of maternal, infants, and young child nutrition related behaviors and care practices, such as handwashing, feeding, and pregnancy care.
